



EASA considerations, leading to the decision not to adopt Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) AD 2021-05-17

On 25 March 2021, the FAA issued <u>AD 2021-05-17</u>, applicable to certain Rockwell Collins, Inc. (Rockwell Collins) FDSA-6500 flight display system applications installed on certain aeroplanes.

That AD requires a revision of the airplane flight manual (AFM) or AFM supplement (AFMS) by introducing a limitation (retained requirement from FAA AD 2019-12-09, which is superseded), and a software update, following which the AFM/AFMS limitation can be removed.

EASA did not adopt <u>FAA AD 2019-12-09</u> and instead, following public consultation through EASA PAD 19-115, issued EASA <u>AD 2019-0179</u> (now at R1) for affected aeroplanes registered in EASA Member States. That AD contains the same requirements as FAA AD 2021-05-17, except with different compliance times.

For the reason described above, EASA has decided not to adopt FAA AD 2021-05-17.
