AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVE

The following airworthiness directive (AD) may be applicable to an aircraft which our records indicate is registered in your name. ADs are issued pursuant to **Canadian Aviation Regulation** (**CAR**) 593. Pursuant to **CAR** 605.84 and the further details of **CAR Standard** 625, **Appendix H**, the continuing airworthiness of a Canadian registered aircraft is contingent upon compliance with all applicable ADs. Failure to comply with the requirements of an AD may invalidate the flight authorization of the aircraft. Alternative means of compliance shall be applied for in accordance with **CAR** 605.84 and the above-referenced **Standard**.

Subject: Bombardier DHC-8 - Bonding Integrity Inspection of Fuselage Skin Panels

Effective: 22 February 2002

Applicability: Bombardier Inc. DHC-8 Model 311, serial numbers 202 to 298

Compliance: When indicated, unless already accomplished.

Background: When the NDT manual, PSM 1-83-7A was reissued at Revision 6, a number of fuselage

skin panels were inadvertently removed from the text. This could result in disbonding occurring in some of these skin panels before the next bonding integrity inspection (scheduled three years after the last inspection as detailed in DHC-8 Maintenance Manual, PSM 1-83-7, Airworthiness Limitations List, Structural Inspection Task 5300/01). Failure of the bonding in the skin panels would result in a reduced load carrying capacity

of the affected panels.

Corrective Actions:

- 1. Within 14 calendar days after the effective date of this directive, review the aircraft maintenance logbook or records to determine if the previous bonding integrity inspection (BII) was performed in accordance with Revision 6 of the NDT manual, PSM 1-83-7A.
- 2. If the BII was performed in accordance with Revision 6 of the NDT manual, inspect the skin panels listed in the table below with the following provisions:
 - (a) If the previous BII inspections of the skin panels listed have not indicated disbonding, then the inspections on these panels must be carried out in accordance with PSM 1-83-7A, Revision 7 within 1,000 hours air time or six months, whichever occurs first, from the effective date of this directive.
 - (b) If any of the skin panels listed had disbond detected during any of the previous inspections, then those panels must be inspected in accordance with PSM 1-83-7A, Revision 7 within six weeks of the effective date of this directive.
- 3. If the previous BII was carried out to PSM 1-83-7A, Revision 5 or Revision 7, no further action is required.
- 4. Once the skin panels listed in the table below have been inspected to PSM 1-83-7A, Revision 7, these panels could revert back to the normal BII program in accordance with DHC-8 Maintenance Manual, PSM 1-83-7, Airworthiness Limitations List, Structural Inspection Task Number 5300/01.
