

AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVE

This Airworthiness Directive (AD) is issued pursuant to Canadian Aviation Regulation (CAR) 521.427. No person shall conduct a take-off or permit a take-off to be conducted in an aircraft that is in their legal custody and control, unless the requirements of CAR 605.84 pertaining to ADs are met. Standard 625 - Aircraft Equipment and Maintenance Standards Appendix H provides information concerning alternative means of compliance (AMOC) to ADs.

Passenger Oxygen System - Incorrect Length of Passenger Oxygen Mask Lanyards

Applicability:

Background:

Bombardier (BA) has determined that the lanyard length of the passenger drop down oxygen masks is too long and may cause the safety pin tethered to the opposite end of the lanyard to remain engaged in the oxygen flow mechanism when the mask is pulled to the passenger's face. In an emergency situation where oxygen is required, it is possible that certain passengers may not receive oxygen supply due to the increased length of the lanyard.

BA has issued service bulletin (SB) 605-35-003 to replace the existing lanyards in the passenger oxygen box assemblies with lanyards of the correct length. Incorporation of this SB will restore the proper oxygen flow functionality to the passenger oxygen masks in the event of an emergency.

This AD mandates the incorporation of BA SB 605-35-003.

Corrective Actions:

Within 2400 flight hours or 60 months, whichever occurs first, from the effective date of this AD, replace the existing lanyards in the passenger oxygen box assemblies with lanyards of the correct length, in accordance with BA SB 605-35-003 Revision 02 dated 18 April 2016, or later revisions approved by the Chief, Continuing Airworthiness, Transport Canada.

Compliance with the Basic Issue or Revision 01 of BA SB 605-35-003, prior to the effective date of this AD, meets the mandated requirements of this AD.
