

Airworthiness Directive AD No.: 2020-0198

Issued: 15 September 2020

Note: This Airworthiness Directive (AD) is issued by EASA, acting in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 on behalf of the European Union, its Member States and of the European third countries that participate in the activities of EASA under Article 129 of that Regulation.

This AD is issued in accordance with Regulation (EU) 748/2012, Part 21.A.3B. In accordance with Regulation (EU) 1321/2014 Annex I, Part M.A.301, the continuing airworthiness of an aircraft shall be ensured by accomplishing any applicable ADs. Consequently, no person may operate an aircraft to which an AD applies, except in accordance with the requirements of that AD, unless otherwise specified by the Agency [Regulation (EU) 1321/2014 Annex I, Part M.A.303] or agreed with the Authority of the State of Registry [Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, Article 71 exemption].

ATA 05 – Time Limits / Maintenance Checks – Safe Life Airworthiness Limitations Items – ALS Part 1 – Amendment

Manufacturer(s): Airbus

Applicability: Airbus A380-841, A380-842 and A380-861 aeroplanes, all manufacturer serial numbers.

Definitions:

For the purpose of this AD, the following definitions apply:

The Variation: Airbus A380 Airworthiness Limitations Section (ALS) Part 1 Variation 11.1.

The AMP: The approved Aircraft Maintenance Programme (AMP) on the basis of which the operator or the owner ensures the continuing airworthiness of each operated A380 aeroplane. For A380 aeroplanes operated under EU regulation, compliance with the approved AMP is required by Commission Regulation (EU) <u>1321/2014</u>, Part M.A.301, paragraph 3.

New and/or more restrictive limitations: This includes all limitations that are new and all limitations for which a threshold was reduced, which were introduced through the Variation (as defined in this AD) since the previous ALS Revision that is currently incorporated in the AMP.



Reason:

The airworthiness limitations for the Airbus A380, which are approved by EASA, are currently defined and published in the Airbus A380 ALS document(s). These instructions have been identified as mandatory for continued airworthiness.

Failure to accomplish these instructions could result in an unsafe condition.

EASA previously issued AD 2019-0217, requiring the actions described in Airbus A380 ALS Part 1 Revision 11.

Since that AD was issued, Airbus published the Variation, as defined in this AD, which contains new and/or more restrictive limitations.

For the reason described above, this AD requires accomplishment of the actions specified in the Variation. EASA AD 2019-0217 is not superseded by this AD.

Required Action(s) and Compliance Time(s):

Required as indicated, unless accomplished previously:

Replacement of Life Limited Parts:

(1) From the effective date of this AD, replace each component before exceeding the applicable life limit, as specified in the Variation, as applicable to aeroplane model and depending on aeroplane configuration.

Where this AD requires a task which is already required per EASA AD 2019-0217, the instructions of the Variation invalidate the instructions of Airbus A380 ALS Part 1 Revision 11.

AMP Revision:

(2) Within 12 months after the effective date of this AD, revise the approved AMP by incorporating the limitations described in the Variation, as applicable to aeroplane model and depending on aeroplane configuration.

Recording AD compliance:

(3) When the AMP of an aeroplane has been revised as required by paragraph (2) of this AD, that action ensures continued accomplishment of the tasks as required by paragraph (1) of this AD for that aeroplane. Consequently, after revising the AMP, as required by paragraph (2) of this AD, it is not necessary that accomplishment of individual action is recorded for demonstration of AD compliance on a continued basis.

The use of later approved revisions of the above-mentioned document is acceptable for compliance with the requirements of this AD.



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Remarks:

- 1. If requested and appropriately substantiated, EASA can approve Alternative Methods of Compliance for this AD.
- 2. This AD was posted on 17 August 2020 as PAD 20-121 for consultation until 14 September 2020. No comments were received during the consultation period.

This may include reporting on the same or similar components, other than those covered by the design to which this AD applies, if the same unsafe condition can exist or may develop on an aircraft with those components installed. Such components may be installed under an FAA Parts Manufacturer Approval (PMA), Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) or other modification.
