



Emergency Airworthiness Directive

AD No.: 2026-0173-E

Issued: 04 September 2026

Note: This Emergency Airworthiness Directive (AD) is issued by EASA, acting in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 on behalf of the European Union, its Member States and of the European third countries that participate in the activities of EASA under Article 129 of that Regulation.

This AD is issued in accordance with Regulation (EU) 748/2012, Part 21.A.3B. In accordance with Regulation (EU) 1321/2014 Annex I Part M.A.301, or Annex Vb Part ML.A.301, as applicable, the continuing airworthiness of an aircraft shall be ensured by accomplishing any applicable ADs. Consequently, no person may operate an aircraft to which an AD applies, except in accordance with the requirements of that AD, unless otherwise specified by the Agency [Regulation (EU) 1321/2014 Annex I Part M.A.303, or Annex Vb Part ML.A.303, as applicable] or agreed with the Authority of the State of Registry [Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, Article 71 exemption].

RB211 Trent 895-17, 892-17, 892B-17, 884-17, 884B-17, 877-17 and Trent 875-17 engines, all serial numbers (s/n).

These engines are known to be installed on, but not limited to, Boeing 777 aeroplanes.

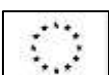
Definitions:

For the purpose of this AD, the following definitions apply:

The NMSB: Rolls-Royce Alert Non-Modification Service Bulletin (NMSB) RB211-79-AL441.

The NMSB has an 'A' (Alert) in the number, but an earlier or later revision may not have that 'A'. This kind of change does not effectively alter the publication references.

Serviceable part: Oil pump having Part Number (P/N) LR47390D, LR37940P, LR37940DD, LR47390B or P/N LR37940N identified as "not affected parts" in section 1.D of NMSB.



Affected part: Oil pump having P/N LR47390D, LR37940P, LR37940DD, LR47390B or P/N LR37940N which are not serviceable parts.

Affected engine: An engine that has an affected part installed.

Reason:

Occurrences of non-conformances were reported, leading to low-oil-pressure events on low life oil pumps. Subsequent investigation identified a potential failure mode affecting the oil pump input-coupling shear neck.

This condition, if not corrected, could lead to a dual in-flight shutdown on aeroplanes equipped with two affected engines, resulting in reduced control of the aeroplane.

To address this potential unsafe condition, Rolls-Royce issued the NMSB providing instructions for de-pairing of engines on twin-engine aeroplanes, ensuring that no affected parts are installed on both engines.

For the reasons described above, this AD requires de-pairing of the engines and ensures that only one affected part is installed on twin-engine aeroplanes.

This AD is considered to be an interim action, and further AD action may follow.

Required Action(s) and Compliance Time(s):

Required as indicated by this AD, unless the action(s) required by this AD have been already accomplished:

De-pairing of engines:

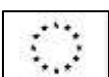
- (1) From the effective date of this AD do not operate an aeroplane having **two** affected engines installed.

Additional Requirements(s):

- (2) Replacement of an affected part with a serviceable part on an engine is an acceptable method to comply with the de-pairing instructions of the paragraph (1) of this AD.
- (3) From the effective date of this AD, it is allowed to reinstall an affected part removed from an affected engine as specified in paragraph (2) of this AD, provided it has been rectified in section 3.B of the NMSB before reinstallation.
- (4) Replacement of one of the affected engines with a non-affected engine is an acceptable method to comply with the de-pairing instructions of requirement of paragraph (1) of this AD.
- (5) From the effective date of this AD, it is allowed to reinstall an engine removed as specified in paragraph (4) of this AD, provided that the affected part has been replaced with a serviceable part in accordance with approved maintenance instructions.

1. If requested and appropriately substantiated, EASA can approve Alternative Methods of Compliance for this AD.
