AEROSPATIALE ALOUETTE II helicopters all types

Main Rotor Blades
Service-Life limit

The present Airworthiness Directive applies to AEROSPATIALE SE 3130, SE 313 B, SA 3180, SA 318 B and C helicopters equipped with main rotor blades P/N 3130S.11.30.000, serial numbers 13846 to 13949 inclusive without the AMS AEROSPATIALE 07 2257.

Subsequent to the discovery of a fatigue problem at the blade spar/fitting assembly, which could lead to loss of the blade, the service-life limit of the blades identified above is reduced to 400 hours. From the effective date of this Airworthiness Directive :

- 1 - blades which have logged more than 375 hours, must be removed from service within the next 25 flying hours.
- 2 - blades which have logged less than 375 hours must be removed from service before they reach 400 flying hours.

The present Revision 1 cancels and replaces the original AD 89-164-047(B) of October 18, 1989
