Reason:	It has been determined that zinc-coated starter ring gears installed on Solo 2625 01 and 2625 02 engines are prone to cracking. Cracks could be the result of hydrogen embrittlement due to the zinc-plating process. As a consequence, this new Airworthiness Directive (AD) mandates repetitive inspections of zinc-coated starter ring gears and their replacement when damage is found.

Required Action(s) and Compliance Time(s):	 Required as indicated, unless accomplished previously: (1) Before further flight after the effective date of this AD, identify the installed version of the starter ring gear (zinc-coated or painted) in accordance with paragraph 1. of the instructions of DG-Flugzeugbau Technical Note (TN) No. 800/36 initial issue or TN No. 843/30 initial issue. (Thereafter named 'the Technical Notes'). 		

	(2) If a zinc-coated starter ring gear is found, before further flight inspect the gear for cracks as instructed in paragraph 2 of the Technical Notes.		
	(2.1) if any crack is found, before further engine operation, replace the starter ring gear as instructed in paragraph 3 of the Technical Notes.		
	(2.2) If no crack is found and until accomplishment of paragraph (3) of this AD, do repetitive inspections of the zinc-coated starter ring gear during every pre-flight check as instructed in paragraphs 2 and 3 of the Technical Notes.		
	(3) At the operator's discretion, replace the zinc-coated starter ring gear with a painted starter ring gear as instructed in paragraph 3 of the Technical Notes.		
	Installation of a painted starter ring gear terminates the repetitive inspection requirements of paragraph (2.2) of this AD.		
	Limited Pilot-Owner Maintenance		
	When/Where Part-M applies the inspection requirements of this AD, can be done under the scope of the limited pilot-owner maintenance authorisation.
