Those documents have been approved by the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and are now referenced in Airbus A330 and A340 Airworthiness Limitations Section (ALS) Part 5 revision 00 (both approved by EASA on 16 November 2011), to comply with EASA policy statement (EASA D 2005/CPRO) which requires Fuel Tank Safety items to be integrated into ALS Part 5. Failure to comply with items as identified in Airbus A330 and A340 ALS Part 5 could result in a fuel tank explosion and consequent loss of the aeroplane. To address this condition, EASA issued: EASA AD 2007-0023 to require compliance with FAL specified in the Airbus A330 FAL Document reference 95A.1932/05 at Issue 02 (comprising maintenance/inspection tasks and Critical Design Configuration Control Limitations (CDCCL)) for A330 aeroplanes, and EASA AD 2006-0205 to require compliance with FAL specified in Airbus A340 FAL Document reference 95A.1933/05 at ssue 01 (comprising maintenance/inspection tasks and Critical Design Configuration Control Limitations (CDCCL)) for Airbus A340 aeroplanes. All other EASA ADs specified in the Supersedure section of this AD required accomplishment of aeroplane modifications related to Fuel Tank Safety items, the requirements and compliance times of which are now integrated into ALS Part 5. For the reasons described above this D retains the requirements of all ADs specified in the Supersedure section of this AD, which are superseded, and requires the implementation of the new or more restrictive maintenance requirements and/or airworthiness limitations as specified in the revision 00 of the Airbus A330 ALS Part 5 and of the Airbus A340 ALS Part 5. 14 September 2012 Effective Date: Required Action(s) Required as indicated, unless previously accomplished: and Compliance (1) Within the compliance times defined in the Record of Revisions (ROR) Time(s): pages of the Airbus A330 ALS Part 5 or A340 ALS Part 5 (hereafter referred to as ALS Part 5), both at Revision 00, as applicable to aeroplane type, comply with all applicable instructions and airworthiness limitations included by reference in the ROR of ALS Part 5 Revision 00, as applicable to aeroplane type. Compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (1) of this AD can be temonstrated by: Revising as follows, the approved Aircraft Maintenance Programme (AMP) on the basis of which the operator or the owner ensures the continuing airworthiness of each operated aeroplane: Incorporate all maintenance and modification requirements, and associated airworthiness limitations specified in the ALS Part 5 Revision 00, as applicable to aeroplane type. and (2.2) Complying with the approved AMP described in paragraph (2.1) of this AD. Ref. Publications: AIRBUS A330 ALS Part 5 Revision 00, and AIRBUS A340 ALS Part 5 Revision 00, both approved by EASA on 16 November 2011. The use of later approved variations or revisions of these documents is acceptable for compliance with the requirements of this AD.
